Many thanks to Trees for Life and Green Communities Canada for a \$2,000 grant, which we used to buy and plant some crabapple trees, a mountain ash, and some highbush cranberry and saskatoon bushes. Nearly 200 people attended our market garden celebration In early September, where people made bouquets, listened to youth fiddlers, heard storytime with the library, and enjoyed the garden site.

Many thanks as well to the family that donated our new Little Seed Library—shaped like a grain elevator. Collect your native and non-native seeds in small envelopes, add a label, and share them with others in this free-to-take seed collection!

Our Little Libraries are filled with books and continue to be well | May 3—World Press Freedom Day; used. Any help with shoveling snow up to the libraries would be speaking truth to power appreciated so that they can be used year-round.

We also were thrilled that SaskTel allowed us to have a local artist Allie Kell paint the utility box with paint donated by Saskatoon Co-op's Communities in Full Colour program. Take a walk by to see the beautiful work.

#### **BUENA VISTA CIVICS UPDATE**

#### **BV L**OSES HISTORIC STATIONS OF THE CROSS AND RELATED STATUES

For decades, Buena Vista residents have been able to enjoy a quasi-public green space and overlook above Gabriel Dumont Park behind the Queen's House of Retreat on the corner of Taylor and Saskatchewan Crescent. The park featured a Stations of the Cross statuary installation placed around a small circular walkway, and other related statues including 'Our Lady of the Prairies' by Edward Gibney, featuring the Virgin Mary holding a sheaf of wheat.

Unfortunately, with the closure of the Queen's House and its transition to a residential addiction treatment facility, the statues have been mostly relocated to a youth camp at Blackstrap, while the Gibney statue is being moved to St. Paul's hospital. The park still features a small bench with a beautiful view of the river but it's unclear if access to the area will be as open to the public as it was under its previous management.

#### **DUTCH ELM DISEASE HITS SASKATOON**

The City's Parks Department confirms a record number of positive cases of Dutch elm disease (DED) across the City. In Buena Vista, most of our streets are lined with elm trees. As a community, we need to act together to protect the health of our urban canopy.

#### WHAT IS IT AND HOW DOES IT SPREAD?

DED is caused by a fungus that clogs the tree's water and nutrient system, eventually killing the tree. Fungal spores spread by contaminated pruning tools or by attaching to elm bark beetles, which do not travel far. The DEDcausing fungus can spread over long distances if transported as firewood.

#### PREVENT THE SPREAD OF DUTCH ELM DISEASE

- Never store elm wood or branches, don't buy or take any from anyone, do not burn it.
- Do not prune elms during the provincial ban (Apr 1 to Aug 31). The beetles are most active then and are attracted to fresh cut wood or tree wounds. Sanitize tools after working on elm trees.
- Do not build treehouses or use nails or screws to attach anything to elm trees: this can attract elm bark beetles.
- Dispose of elm at the City landfill immediately—it's free—even if during the provincial pruning ban. Do not put it in your green bin or take it to the compost depot.

#### HOW DO I KNOW IF IT'S AN UNHEALTHY ELM?

Symptoms include wilting and yellowing leaves that curl and turn brown. This can happen as soon as June.
